## course description

The course aims to bring an exploration of the built environment and particularly interior spaces regarding their sensory, psychological interrelationships with users and inhabitants. Considering that the essential concerns of human experience, shelter, and comfort are inseparable from the atmospheric qualities of space, whether from a poetic or a practical perspective, the discussions will begin with introducing elements of the atmosphere in the context of spatial design. This part will be followed by the examination of the interaction between human behavior and the interior environment. The course will overview a broad range of user experiences afforded by different types, components, and facets of interiors throughout the term.

Each week there will be a different theme, and related readings, assignments, and resource materials will be posted on Blackboard. Students are expected to read or watch all of the uploaded material before the classes and complete pre-class and in (after)-class assignments.
