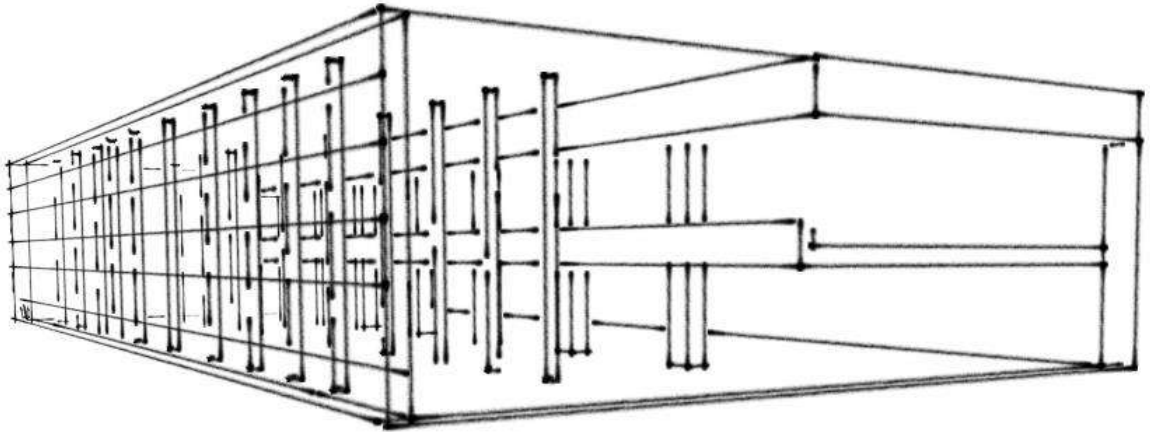
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> Definition

> INT 202 Studio Outcomes

At the end of the semester students will;

- gain an introductory understanding of interior architecture and user-centred design.
- form scenarios and create user profiles according to a detailed life style or a consistent design idea.
- comprehend the types and degrees of volumetric accommodation of activities in an interior space, enclosure, functions, and spatial scale and continuity.
- employ programming and research techniques.
- develop interior design related competencies such as, detail drawing, preparing material boards, presentation and portfolio files.

> Attendance
